Module objectives/intended learning outcomes	<p>Train the students' critical thinking skills in reading activities that include</p> <p>(a) before the reading is done,</p> <p>(b) at the time of reading is in progress, and</p> <p>(c) after the reading is over.</p> <p>The critical thinking skills are trained before the reading activity is conducted include</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) the ability to check the book parts in order to determine whether or not a book is relevant to the students' reading needs. (2) the reading activity is in progress, the students are trained to critically identify the ideas that are relevant to their reading needs by means of annotations. In addition, the students are also trained to identify various ideas, such as the main ideas, supporting ideas, counter arguments, and refutations. At the same time, students are also trained to make the best use of their linguistic knowledge and world knowledge as well as the contexts in the reading text to know the meaning of an unfamiliar word by guessing. (3) when the reading is over, the students are trained to be able to critically summarize in their own words (paraphrasing) the article before they respond the article in a summary-response essay while applying the correct citation in their essay.
